At the same time, I was developing an electronic music project with a friend, exploring new sounds and forms of expression. I also played in contemporary music groups with Christian themes for more than seven years, which allowed me to explore the spiritual dimension of music. I also created music for theater productions, which taught me how sound can deepen the narrative and emotions of characters. Currently, as an independent artist, I am looking for new means of expression to convey the complexity of human emotions and experiences. Participation in the residency is an opportunity for me to further my artistic development and explore sound as a tool to express character emotions and build a deep relationship with the viewer. I would like to create music that not only accompanies the performance, but becomes an integral part of it, moving the viewer on many levels.

In 2024 she took part in the project "Inclusion in motion" at the Central Textile Museum in Lodz.

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
Agnieszka Dubilewicz

He believes that theaters should be accessible to male and female artists with disabilities and audiences with disabilities, so that as many people as possible have a chance to fulfill their dreams. Each time she emphasizes that art does not have to be art therapy, it can be an idea for life that opens up completely new possibilities for development.

Giammarco Pignatiello

Theatre director, born in Foggia in 1997. He began his theatre journey with Piccola Compagnia Impertinente in 2015, where he directed, wrote, and acted in various children's theatre productions supported by Teatro Pubblico Pugliese. Specifically for young audiences, he created the project Dauni Story, winner of the regional call I Musei Raccontano la Puglia, sponsored by the Ministry of Culture. Since 2018, he has led theatre workshops for children, particularly through the project Al buio al buio! supported by the regional call Periferie al Centro. As an actor, he has taken part in several international theatre festivals, including Kestenburg in Banja Luka, FIST in Belgrade, and FITUC in Casablanca. He later graduated in Theatre Directing from the Paolo Grassi Civic School of Theatre. In 2023, he worked as assistant director on La Locandiera, directed by Antonio Latella. In 2024, he won the Testinscena call by Fondazione Claudia Lombardi per il Teatro, with the patronage of LAC Lugano Arte e Cultura, Hystrio, Campo Teatrale (Milan), and FIT Festival Internazionale del Teatro (Lugano).

Alessandra Curia

Cosenza, 2001. Graduated in 2023 from the Accademia dei Filodrammatici in Milan and winner of the 2024 Hystrio alla Vocazione Prize. In 2023, she performed in The Trials, directed by Veronica Cruciani, and in The Prisoner's Dilemma, directed by Bruno Fornasari. In 2024, she played a supporting role in the film La versione di Giuda, directed by Giulio Base (prod. Agnus Dei). For the past two years, she has toured with the children's theatre production Favola senza Tempo (directed by Fabrizio Visconti), produced by the company Eccentrici Dadarò, with whom she also leads school workshops. She also takes part in the musical project C'era due volte Lucio, directed by Marco Pagani (prod. Eccentrici Dadarò), as a singer.





Benedetta Pigoni

Born in 2000 in Reggio Emilia, she shaped her education around two passions: the study of Japanese language and culture at the Languages, Markets and Cultures of Asia programme at the Alma Mater Studiorum, and theatre training. In 2020, she combined these interests in the project Vento dell'Est, aimed at bringing storytelling for children through the Japanese theatre technique of kamishibai. In 2021, she took part in Animateria, an advanced course in figure theatre promoted by Teatro Gioco Vita and Teatro del Drago, where she deepened her skills in puppetry and visual language. Since 2023, she has worked as a puppeteer with the Carlo Colla e Figli company as part of the exhibition Marionette all'Avanguardia, directed by James Bradburne. Also in 2023, her play 30 milligrams of Ulipristal won both the Amleta ConTest and the Tondelli Prize within the Riccione Theatre Prize. In 2024, she travelled to South Korea as dramaturg, overseeing the staging of 30 milligrams of Ulipristal with a Korean cast, in a production by the Seoul Institute of the Arts. She is currently attending the Writing for Performance course at the Paolo Grassi Civic School of Theatre.

Cristian Visione

Reggio Emilia, 1999. After attending the graphic design programme at the Blaise Pascal Institute in Reggio Emilia, he founded the association Favola Semplice in February 2020. The association promotes awareness around all forms of disability through engaging and inclusive workshops in schools. In 2020, he described his experience as a person with a disability navigating the internet in the book Cuori Connessi, co-written with journalist Luca Pagliari. In 2018, he published a provocative post on Facebook: "Looking for friends, I'll pay seven euros per hour." Within 24 hours, the post went viral, receiving over four thousand responses from people eager to meet him. He used the media attention to shed light on the loneliness many young people with disabilities experience, often due to lack of autonomy and architectural barriers.



Group Another Name – Calling ourselves Juliet and Romeo



Luce Sant'Ambrogio

My path moves between academia and the stage. I graduated with honors in Theatre and Performing Arts from IUAV University of Venice, and I earned a PhD in Gender and Performance Studies. At the same time, I trained in acting at the Quelli di Grock school and attended many workshops with contemporary artists (Motus, Societas Raffaello Sanzio, Silvia Calderoni, Arkadi Zaides, Liv Ferracchiati, Dante Antonelli, Tindaro Granata). I've worked with institutions such as Teatro Stabile di Genova, AtelierSì, Marcela Serli, Simona Bertozzi, and I collaborate regularly with Giacomo AG on the Anticorpo project. I am a trans woman. In theatre, this has often meant being considered "out of role," out of place, out of time. My master's thesis, Who Can Play Juliet?, explores exactly these topics, and it was awarded and published. I chose to bring theory into practice, because the stage is one of the spaces where the marginalization of trans bodies manifests most strongly—through explicit exclusions and narrative stereotypes. I have experienced many forms of marginalization: from academic transphobia to online insults, from the constant pressure to justify my body to the spectacle made of my identity. Visibility often means exposure. But I remain. Because my presence on stage is a political act. I want to build imaginaries that include, that harm less, that open up new possibilities. I take part in this project because it's a collective response to systemic exclusion. Because Romeo and Juliet is a terrain to be tenderly dismantled. Because we, too, can love with the same intensity as the great classics—without having to justify the bodies we inhabit.



Giacomo AG

I am a trans, feminist, and queer person with Italo-Brazilian roots. My artistic practice began in 2015 in contexts of independent training, starting from a workshop dedicated to masculine gender identities (Figli Maschi). Since then, I've moved through experimental theatre environments and hybrid performance practices, collaborating and training with groups such as Atopos, ATIR Teatro Ringhiera, Fattoria Vittadini, the Santarcangelo Festival, the Orlando Festival, and the performance The Present is Not Enough by Silvia Calderoni and Ilenia Caleo. Since 2019, I've been developing Anticorpo, a theatrical and political project created to carve out a self-determined trans space within the Italian theatre landscape. Being a trans person has deeply shaped my artistic path. In Italy, theatre continues to pretend there's a kind of neutrality in bodies on stage, but that neutrality is often just adherence to a cis, white, able-bodied norm. Non-conforming bodies struggle to access spaces of training, visibility, and recognition. To this, I add my migratory background: I was born in Brazil to a Brazilian family and raised in Italy, where I've experienced marginalization in linguistic and cultural terms as well. My work stems from these wounds and travels through them, searching for utopian spaces where the trans body can be seen, heard, desired—not only narrated. I take part in this project to reclaim the possibility of embodying roles that have historically been denied to us, and to contribute to the construction of new imaginaries. I see theatre as a transformative device, where the stage becomes a space for poetic justice.

Yele Canali Ferrari

Yele Canali Ferrari is a gender deserter, actor and performer. He trained at Teatro delle Briciole in Parma and with choreographer Daniele Albanese/ Compagnia Stalker. He collaborates with the production centre La Piccionaia in Vicenza and with the association MicroMacro ETS. For the association Malerba, he works on the project MuSeMu - Musei Senza Mura, organizing soundwalks through city neighbourhoods. Together with Riccardo Reina and in collaboration with the historical archive Centro Studi Movimenti, he created the format Scorribanda Antifascista, which blends itinerant performances with protest marches. Since 2024, he has collaborated with the theatre company Hombre Collettivo on the play Alle armi. With AZ Theatre, he took part in the project Gaza ora - messages from a dear friend for the performance at Teatri di Vita. In 2024, together with Ale Festa and with the complicity of Giacomo AG/Mistura Queer, he launched the artistic project Temporary Blooming Zone — a space of temporary autonomous creation rooted in a transfeminist and queer perspective. He is currently attending the advanced training course for multiskilled technicians run by Santarcangelo Festival and Cronopios.





Federica Lorenzoni

I was born in 2001 in Carrara. I am currently completing my degree in Foreign Languages and Literatures at the University of Milan, with a specialization in English and Russian. I have a strong passion for theatre, which I have pursued both academically and practically. Throughout my studies, I focused in particular on 20th-century English and European playwriting, participated in university theatre workshops, and completed an internship at Teatro Elfo Puccini, where I engaged with the contemporary theatre scene. I speak English fluently (C2 level) and continue to improve my Russian. I am especially interested in the intersection between language, literature, and performance, and in how theatre can serve as a vehicle for cultural and linguistic expression.

Group To be Young, Gifted and Black



Gaja Aurora Ebere Ikeagwuana

I was born in Milan in 2000 to an Italian mother and a Nigerian father. I am a queer and neurodivergent performer. I have been studying acting since 2006, from amateur schools to professional and self-managed paths from 2017 to the present. My artistic path has developed between theatre, performance, contemporary arts studies, and community work. I have attended acting workshops such as Piccola Università Teatrale, vocal training with Netflix scholarships for voiceover work, and artistic projects with a strong social impact, such as the Milan Mediterranea participatory arts center and festivals like Short Theatre and Twiza. My approach is deeply influenced by intersectionality: I relate body, identity, gender, and class with hybrid artistic languages. As a neurodivergent, racialized, and queer woman, I feel I belong to systematically underrepresented and discriminated groups in Italy. I have always moved in spaces that were not designed for bodies and minds like mine. In fact, access to artistic education has often been hindered by structural barriers. These barriers are not just physical: they are often economic, systemic, and narrative. However, these barriers are also the engine of my artistic work: I do not seek to adapt to imposed narratives, but to dismantle them from within, bringing to the stage the complexity of existing on the margins. I believe in the power of collective creation as a form of care, resistance, and possibility. Being part of the UAD project means for me to move in a space that values complexity and heterogeneity. A context where art doesn't ask to adapt but transforms to include.



Mat Diouf

I am a Senegalese DJ and producer, 27 years old, and I have lived in Italy for 12 years. My music blends deep bass, electro, dub, and Afro-futuristic influences, creating an immersive sonic experience that connects tradition and innovation. For me, sound is a tool to imagine new worlds: through my selections and productions, I try to evoke possible futures, where African roots coexist with present-day technologies and desires. As a black migrant, I have encountered many difficulties accessing artistic and professional spaces. Language barriers, systemic racism, and the lack of real representation in cultural institutions have often excluded or made me invisible. However, these experiences have shaped my sound: an electronic language that also speaks of identity and diaspora. With every track I play, I try to create a bridge between memories and dreams, a place where even those on the margins can recognize themselves, dance, and feel part of it. Participating in the UAD project means for me entering an international dialogue that does not demand assimilation but offers differences the opportunity to shine.

Laura Amponsah

Born in Ghana in 1996 and residing in Italy for twenty years. I define myself as Italian, even though not by law nor citizenship. I study Communication Sciences and have been active as a slam poetry performer since 2019. My poetic research is rooted in the body and develops at the intersection between language and identity: I am interested in words as a tool for resistance, and the stage as a place to claim visibility. My entry into the artistic world happened independently, on the margins. My voice found space in the queer and underground contexts of spoken word and poetry slam, from the Bergamasco province to the Italian peninsula, where stories like mine are not only accepted but celebrated. I belong to multiple underrepresented categories: I am a young, black, trans woman and precarious. I have lived experiences of exclusion both bureaucratic and cultural, which are reflected in the impossibility of fully accessing official artistic paths. However, these barriers have nourished my creative practice: I write and perform to overturn the sense of absence, to build a language that belongs to me and speaks of me and our communities, in my own words. Participating in UAD represents for me a precious opportunity to expand my work within a context that recognizes the politics of the body, language, and inclusion as central elements of artistic creation.





Val Wandja

I was born in Rome in 1998 to an Italian mother and a Cameroonian father. At the age of eight, I convinced my mother to let me skip the last hour of school on Fridays so I could attend a theatre workshop, and for years I took part in theatre labs—first in Italy and then in Australia. In 2020, I graduated from Centro Studi Acting in Rome. During the first lockdown, I took a playwriting course that led me to write, direct, and perform my first theatre piece, Prossima Puntata, winner of the "Dominio Pubblico Under 25" call, which premiered at Spazio Rossellini. That same year, together with Yonas Aregay, I created Anatomia di un fiore, a study that won the "Powered by REF" grant and was presented at Romaeuropa Festival and Direction Under 30 in 2022. In 2023, I was invited as a poet by Fondazione Sozzani x MQBM-BQ and by Palazzo Delle Esposizioni x Spazio Griot. That same year, I took part in Solinas Experimenta with Rebecca Ricci, Jonas Davì, and Michael Campisano with Nathan K., a winning project produced by RaiPlay; at the same time, I was a finalist in Solinas Netflix – Bottega della Sceneggiatura. Together with Raffaele laccarino and Giacomo Zibardi, I participated in Milano Pitch 2023, winning in the Cinema section with Il mio primo school shooting, currently in production. In 2024, I am part of the cast of African American Drama on The Italian Stage at Teatro Torlonia; of Le Bakkanti by Didi Diaz, winner of the Leo De Berardinis grant; and of 30 Milligrammi di Ulipristal, produced by Teatro Stabile di Bolzano. I decided to take part in UAD because I am interested in projects that support the development and research phase, offering artists space and time free from production rhythms and national boundaries. A space that encourages the conversations necessary for experimentation and critical questioning—especially for a project that requires time for linguistic exploration; a time that, in my view, is essential to translate, transform, and resemanticize the words of a fundamental author like Audre Lorde.

Aleksandar Ćirić

I am an award winning art photographer, journalist and awarded documentary movie creator. My latest project about famouse artist — scoulptor, Zoran Mojsilov, who live in the USA, was selected on 20 international documentary movie festivals all over the World, won 9 awards so far. World premiere was held in the USA, Minesotta, Sant Paul, Main Cinema, European premiere on Martovski festival, Belgrade. Fluent in English, Russian, Bulgarian, basic German. An Economist by education. President of Photo club Focus Pirot, lead a numerous Schools of photography for youngsters, art photo exibitions etc.

Andela Zec

I hold a Master's degree in German and English language, literature, and culture. Currently, I work as a freelance journalist, editor, and entrepreneur in the non-governmental sector. Six years ago, I received an award as a journalist committed to the social inclusion of persons with disabilities in all areas of society, including the arts. The award was presented at the 24th International Festival of Reportage and Media – Interfer in Belgrade. Last year, through Kulturanova, I participated as a candidate for a Visegrad Fund grant at an academy focused on artivism, organized by the NGO Pro Progresione from Budapest. I am applying for this project specifically because I have two ideas in the field of performing arts that I would like to develop in terms of production within the framework of this initiative. The first idea involves using storytelling as a methodology of artivism, presented in the form of a stage performance focused on ecology. The second idea is to create a theatre production based on a play by British Nobel laureate Harold Pinter. As someone with a background in literature and theatre, I've noticed that Pinter's work is unfortunately underrepresented in Serbian theatre. This is especially disappointing given that he was a public supporter of the Serbian people and openly opposed the UK's involvement in the NATO bombing of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia.





Jovan Pantovic

Jovan is a Serbian filmmaker born in 1985. He has been a very passionate animal lover as a child, and together with his brother Uros, he was learning about ornithology. Then he entered the world of music and had his own band, but finally decided to study film production. It was all so very confusing to him until 2005 when he was introduced to a documentary where he worked as a PA on a Channel 4 British production of GUCA documentary: https://www.imdb.com/title/tt1123383/. After that, he was a permanent member of the most influential documentary workshop in Serbia within Magnificient 7 film festival (https://magnificent7festival.org/en/index.php), led by Svetlana and Zoran Popovic. It is here where he decided he would work with documentaries forever. And he still does.

Tanisije Ćakić

Tanasije Ćakić is a graduate actor with experience in theatre directing, drama pedagogy, and casting education, having also worked as a casting director. Through his artistic work, he also creates original projects inspired by personal experiences and perspectives, focusing on themes such as men's mental health, the demonization of queer relationships, life in micro-communities, and the nightlife culture in Belgrade. These topics are explored through various forms — from writing a TV series script, developing a one-man show "After", to directing theatre productions such as "Crime on goat island" (exploring the demonization of queer love), "Monstrum" (addressing victim-blaming in cases of sexual abuse, inspired by Lady Gaga's The Fame Monster album), and "Marriage Play" (a critique of toxic marital dynamics presented through a fictional TV show format). He is particularly interested in formal experimentation and shaping the artistic form to best communicate the theme in a coherent and impactful way. Through his work, Ćakić aims to challenge and dismantle latent or explicit homophobia within the Serbian performing arts scene, advocating for equal access to creative expression for LGBT+ individuals — even when their work is not directly related to sexual identity. He has also acted in both domestic and international film and TV productions, including "The Ark" and "The Librarians: The Next Chapter".





Milica Dukic

Milica Dukic (b. 1989, Serbia) holds Bachelor's and Master's degrees in painting, as well as a Master's degree in drawing, from the Academy of Fine Arts in Novi Sad. With a wide artistic practice encompassing embroidery, photography, and textile art, she has showcased her work in 16 solo exhibitions and over 100 collective projects. Passionate about promoting inclusivity through art, she has volunteered at ,Milan Petrović' School in Novi Sad and AKIM' in Jerusalem, conceptualizing and leading collaborative projects, such as ,Textile Newspapers'. As an active member of MMC ,LedArt', Milica has been deeply involved in the local art scene for many years. In 2018, Milica achieved the status of an independent visual artist. Drawing from her experience as an artist-in- residence at Ecole d'Humanité (2017/2018) in Switzerland and at the Art Cube Artists' Studios in Jerusalem (2023), she brings a rich and varied perspective to her artistic practice.
